## CHURCH FOR THE YOUNG CHILD

We rejoice in Christ's invitation: "Let the little children come to me and forbid them not." Our goal is to help parents teach their children how to sit and worship with their family. Infants and young children are always welcome in our worship service, and their occasional unexpected voices simply add "happy sounds" to our praise of God. If a child is making enough noise to interfere with other people's worship, we ask that you walk them out of the main sanctuary, wait for them to quiet down and then return to the sanctuary with them. It is important to show kids that making noise doesn't get them out of church. You may feel awkward leaving a couple of times during the service, but we understand. You may find it helpful to sit in the back, near the doors to make the process a little easier.



### **Sermon Series: Exodus**

We will be working through most of the book of Exodus between Easter and summer (April 16-July 2). It is a great book and a lot of foundational theology that will carry through all of scripture and through today. Our daily readings will cover Exodus for part of this series. Read up on Exodus as we learn about God's plan of deliverance- for them and for us.

### **Vocational Identity - New Sunday Morning Adult Ed. Study**

"Who are you?" Has that question ever been asked of you before? If so, what is your typical response? How does your response reflect what you think of yourself and your identity? For the next two Sundays we are going to be exploring the "Who am I?" question in light of what God has to say about you. Come and engage in conversation around this topic and explore the difference between a performance based identity and one that is based in freedom. We will be meeting in the upper room.

### **Men's Kegger Bible study:**

We will meet for four weeks- May 10, 17, 24 and 31. We meet at 6pm and finish at 7:30pm. We have hotdogs, chips, beer and coke. If you want something else- different drink, desserts, etc., bring your own. If you have never been to a kegger you are missing out! It is a relaxing and casual time. If you can show up at 5:15 or so to help set up that would be great!

### **Men's Retreat:**

We will have our summer retreat August 4-6. We will be going down to Palm Desert. The best part of the trip is the food. We usually eat at a couple of 'Diner, Drive ins and Dive' places. There will be golf on Saturday and/or Sunday for those who are interested. If you want to hang out at a pool all weekend, you can do that. Basically, the mornings and afternoons are yours to do what you want. We will have a bible study in the evenings. We try to keep the costs down. It will be about \$100 for the condo for the weekend. And yes, it will be hot.

### **Reading the Bible in a year.**

Do you want to read the bible in less than a year? If you read four chapters a day, you will finish the bible in about 10 months. The readings will take between 25-30 minutes. You can read two chapters in the morning and two at night or two in the morning, one in the afternoon and one at night? Add your five minutes of prayer and you will be good to go. THIS CHALLENGE IS NOT FOR EVERYONE! Maybe now is not the time. You can build up to it. Try reading at least two chapters a day and you will be developing the discipline to get to this project. There is a reading guide to help you with this reading project. I recommend a Psalm a day and three chapters starting with Genesis 1. When you complete the book of Psalms, read one chapter from Proverbs and three chapters of where you are at the time. Don't be afraid to try this one. It is hard but it is doable. Look for the yellow card stock sheet on the counter as you enter the sanctuary.

### **Prayers for Navajo**

I was truly overwhelmed by the tremendous blessing of so many monetary gifts. We leave very early Monday morning (May 15) and return early evening on Monday, May 22. I look forward to sharing our adventures with you when I return.
